Growth Management, 30 Years Later

When Carlsbad voters passed the Growth Management Program in 1986, they chose an approach that would help ensure the city's quality of life




by putting strict conditions on future growth, limiting the total amount of housing that would be allowed, requiring development to pay for infrastructure improvements and setting aside nearly 40 percent of the city as permanent open space.

Are We There Yet?

As you have probably noticed, there is a lot of construction going on around Carlsbad lately, partially due to projects put on hold during the recession all getting started around the same time. At the height of development activity in the 90s, more than 2,000 residential building permits were approved in a year. Today, that number is typically in the low hundreds.

Growth Management and Population

If Carlsbad didn't implement its Growth Management Program, the city would have about twice as many people at "build out," the time when all major new development has occurred.
